## Reunion '98 - Last Rites for Mother Shak

As if there weren't enough good reasons to come to the Reunion - seeing your buddies, playing the good ol' tunes, drinking, seeing Barnes, seeing Barnes drinking - there's now one more reason. This reunion, which marks the Shak's 25th year of use by the Band, will also be the **last event held in the Shak**. The Shak is scheduled to be torn down in late October of 1998 to allow the University to build offices for its new Alumni Association/Office of Development conglomeration.

Surprised? We were too. We learned of the University's plans while most of staph was in China (see back page) in July. This lack of internal communication in the University has left us somewhat in the lurch. Last Spring, we made arrangements with the Athletic Department for the Band to get a wing of Encina Gym after its retrofitting. The wing would be remodeled to fit our specifications (large rehearsal room, office space, etc.). However, the timetable for the Stanford Museum to move out of Encina and the repairs to be made leaves the Band with a window of eighteen months to two years in which we'll have to use a different space.

We're currently working with the University and the

Athletic Department to find an acceptable space for the interim period. There are a number of options, but competition for space on campus is fierce, and we will have to fight tooth and nail for a new home. The Athletic Department and Dr. Leland have been quite helpful, but the situation has not yet been resolved.

Our greatest asset in this fight is the dedication of the student body, the Stanford community, and alumni to the Band. The University can be forced

to pay attention to our needs if we can demonstrate a wide base of alumni support.

**What can you do?** Write a letter to Gerhard. Sing the Band's praises. Tell him it's important to you that the Band be adequately housed now and in the future. Write a letter to the ProvoSt. Tell her that alumni won't stand by and let the Band suffer from University neglect.

So come to Reunion and see the Shak one last time - the Bottic Target, the bathroom fixtures in Mich Terrace, the boob-prints in the Dollie Room, the Tenr Loft, Shak Baby, the signs, the smells, the garden of earthly delights... And come to show your support for the Band.
